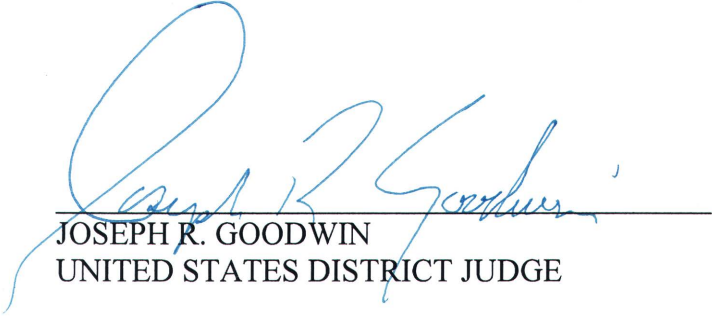

PRETRIAL ORDER # 102
(Order re: Work up of 200 Individual Cases)

It is **ORDERED** that the Plaintiffs and C. R. Bard, Inc. ("Bard") shall work up two hundred (200) cases through discovery and the filing of dispositive motions. I refer the parties to PTO # 65 entered in the Boston Scientific MDL, MDL 2326, and attached hereto for ease of reference. Briefly, each side may choose 100 cases for discovery (both individual and expert) and the filing of dispositive motions (where appropriate) so that I may ready these cases to be tried, either here in the Southern District (with waivers where necessary) or in the plaintiff's home district in either individual or consolidated trials. The parties should use the Boston Scientific PTO, which was negotiated by the parties, as a guide, along with the court's other docket control orders. Unlike the Boston Scientific PTO, I expect the parties to include in their proposed Docket Control Order, (1) deadlines regarding expert discovery and depositions; (2) complete deadlines for fact discovery; and (3) rolling deadlines for dispositive motions. It is further **ORDERED** that the parties submit the proposed Docket Control Order to the court's law clerk via email on or before **January 23, 2014**.

The court **DIRECTS** the Clerk to file a copy of this order in 2:10-md-2187 and it shall apply to each member related case previously transferred to, removed to, or filed in this district, which includes counsel in all member cases up to and including civil action number 2:14-cv-01461. In cases subsequently filed in this district, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action at the time of filing of the complaint. In cases subsequently removed or transferred to this court, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action upon removal or transfer. It shall be the responsibility of the parties to review and abide by all pretrial orders previously entered by the court. The orders may be accessed through the CM/ECF system or the court's website at www.wvsd.uscourts.gov.
