PRETRIAL ORDER # 11

(Rule 12(b)(6) Motions, Next Telephone Status Conference, Staying of Scheduling Orders)

By PTO # 9 (Direct Filing Order; Master Complaint, Short Form Complaint, Amended Short Form Complaint and Master Responsive Pleadings Due Date) entered May 29, 2014, I ordered that the Neomedic Defendants shall have thirty (30) days from the entry of the PTO to file any motion asserting that the Master Complaint fails to state a claim upon which relief may be granted, pursuant to Rule 12(b)(6), and plaintiffs shall have twenty (20) days thereafter to respond to the same. It is **ORDERED** that the Neomedic defendants shall have until **July 31**, **2014**, to file any such motion; with responses due twenty (20) days thereafter.

It is further **ORDERED** that the court will conduct a telephone status conference with leadership counsel on **Wednesday**, **September 17**, **2014**, **at 10:00 a.m.**

Finally, by PTO # 7 (Initial Hearing Summary, Counsel Structure, Plan for Proceeding Forward, Future Status Conferences) entered May 13, 2014, I stayed the scheduling orders entered in individual cases then filed in this MDL for sixty (60) days. It is **ORDERED** that the scheduling orders in those cases are stayed until **September 17, 2014.**

The court **DIRECTS** the Clerk to file a copy of this order in 2:14-md-2511 and it shall apply to each member case previously transferred to, removed to, or filed in this district, which includes counsel in all member cases up to and including civil action number 2:14-cv-20504. In cases subsequently filed in this district, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action at the time of filing of the complaint. In cases subsequently removed or transferred to this court, a copy of the most recent pretrial order will be provided by the Clerk to counsel appearing in each new action upon removal or transfer. It shall be the responsibility of the parties to review and abide by all pretrial orders previously entered by the court. The orders may be accessed through the CM/ECF system or the court's
