**PRETRIAL ORDER # 36
(Order re: Mandatory Settlement Conference)**

Less than ten unresolved cases against Neomedic International, S.L., Desarrollo e Investigación Médica Aragonesa, S.L. (“DIMA”), Specialties Remeex, International, S.L., and/or Neomedic, Inc. (collectively, “Neomedic”) remain in this MDL and others assigned to me. In Pretrial Order No. 34, I stated that if the case of plaintiff Donna McDonald, MDL 2511 Civil Action No. 2:15-cv-05959, was not resolved or dismissed by December 16, 2016, the Court would conduct a settlement conference in Charleston, West Virginia on January 4, 2017. I also stated that I would enter an order confirming that the settlement conference would be conducted.


It is **ORDERED** as follows:

1. The Court will conduct a mandatory settlement conference in Charleston, West Virginia at the Robert C. Byrd United States Courthouse, Room 7800 beginning at 9:00 a.m. on January 4, 2017, and continuing from day-to-day thereafter, in the case of *Donna McDonald v. Neomedic*, MDL 2511 Civil Action No. 2:15-cv-05959.
2. Plaintiff Donna McDonald shall appear in person for the settlement conference with counsel of record as reflected on the docket sheet for her individual case.

3. If Plaintiff Donna McDonald fails to comply with this Pretrial Order, she may be subject to a substantial sanction, including dismissal with prejudice.
4. If the parties reach a settlement prior to January 4, 2017, submission of an inactive docket order for that case will relieve plaintiff and her counsel from the obligation of attending the mandatory settlement conference.
5. Cases or claims against Neomedic not settled during the settlement conference will be dealt with by further order.

The Court **DIRECTS** the Clerk to file a copy of this order in 2:14-md-2511 *and in the individual case cited above*. It shall be the responsibility of the parties to review and abide by all pretrial orders previously entered by the Court. The orders may be accessed through the CM/ECF system or the Court's website at www.wvsd.uscourts.gov.
